

Do you like + Does he like Categories Coin Game

Work in groups of two or three. Toss a coin, covering it with your other hand to keep it secret from your partner. Look at the coin without showing it to your partner. If it shows heads, you should ask a question to get a "Yes, I do" answer from your partner. If it shows tails, you should ask a question to get a "No, I don't" answer from your partner. When your partner answers, show the coin to them. You get one point if they gave the correct answer ("Yes" for heads or "No" for tails), but no point if they gave the opposite answer.

Heads	Tails (=side with the number)
Yes, I do.	No, I don't.

After playing that game for three minutes, do the same but first flipping the coin to decide which category of things you should ask questions about, using the table below. With that first flip of the coin you can show your partner if heads or tails comes up so that they know what you will ask them about. Then toss the coin again, this time to decide if you want to get a yes or no answer, and so as before not showing heads or tails until after your partner answers. Your teacher will tell you which number row you should use or if you can choose which row each time.

	Heads	Tails (=side with the number)
1	Sports	Colours
2	Foods	Drinks
3	Places	Clothes
4	Animals	Activities (= Actions)
5	School subjects	Music
6	Fruit	Vegetables
7	Things from different countries	Times (seasons, months, etc)
8	Feelings	People (family members, etc)
9	Yes, ... does.	No,... doesn't.

Choose a category from above and work together to brainstorm as many questions on that topic as you can.

Play the same coin game, but this time with "Yes, he/ she/ it does" and "No, he/ she/ it doesn't" answers to questions about your teacher, family, friends, people you see every day, etc.

Heads	Tails (=side with the number)
Yes, he/ she/ it does.	No, he/ she/ it doesn't.
