

## It is/ They are & my/ your/ his/ her drawing game

Students make sentences with the cards below and can then draw those things on pictures of themselves, their partner or teacher, a boy and/ or a girl depending on which possessive adjectives they choose. They can add the “-s” card if they want to draw more than one.

With lower level classes, you might want to play without the adjectives and/ or start the game with student drawing on any picture that they like by using the “a” card, then move onto using possessive adjectives.
