coin – It's something which is good luck if you find it in your Xmas pudding.

cranberry sauce – It's a kind of jam that is eaten with but turkey but which isn't too sweet because it's made from very sour fruit.

elf – It's the creature who make toys for Santa to give to children.

Epiphany/ January 6th – It's the time when you should take down your Xmas decorations.

fireplace – It's a place where children leave their stockings to be filled by Santa.
